SPECTATOR GUIDE

Spectator Safety

Spectators may watch International Rally New York only from designated Spectator Areas supervised by trained Safety Marshals and equipped with emergency radio communications and other emergency services. The access to each Spectator Area is along a separate access road and not over the Special Stage road. Spectators are prohibited from entering and walking along the Special Stage road. For your safety, please obey the instructions of Safety Marshals in the Spectator Areas.

Please drive safely and obey speed limits
We never race on public roads open to regular traffic

Welcome to International Rally New York 2006!

The best rally drivers from the United States and from abroad will compete in this exciting event. The course is 300 miles long with 100 miles of Special Stages. International Rally New York 2006 is the sixth round of the United States Rally Championship. It is an FIA internationally listed event that is sanctioned by USAC. Each day of this two-day Rally also separately counts toward the New York Rally Championship. The two events of the New York Rally Championship are sanctioned by Rally New York, Ltd. We are grateful to the Government of the County of Sullivan, the Town of Tusten, the Management of the Ten Mile River Scout Reservation, the Sullivan County Visitors Association, local business and civic organizations, residents and local businesses, sponsors, law enforcement agencies, MobileMedic EMS, Narrowsburg and Lava Fire Departments, Lander's River Trips and Campground, countless volunteer Marshals and amateur radio operators from Mt. Beacon Amateur Radio Club for their support.

What is a Stage Rally?

It is a car rally with a number of Special Stages linked together by transit sections. The rally cars are typically small sedans such as Subaru Impreza. On the Special Stages on public roads closed to civilian traffic, the rally cars start at one-minute intervals and race against the clock. On the transit sections, the rally cars drive in regular traffic and obey all traffic laws. If a competitor is observed speeding on a transit section, he is penalized and may be disqualified from the rally.
