3.4 Two separate events of NYRC

Entrants who compete in NYRC events only and do not enter the USRC event are not subject to overnight Parc Ferme.

3.6 Entries Accepted for NYRC

All entrants (driver and co-driver) may compete only if they hold a valid rally competition license issued by any bona fide motorsport sanctioning entity.

The license must be in the English language or it must be accompanied by an official English translation. FIA International Rally License must be accompanied by a letter of approval to participate in this event from your ASN.

Rally New York, Ltd. reserves the right to refuse any entry.

3.7 USRC Classes

Western competitors will receive a \$150 refund at Registration.

The organizer will provide parking, storage and work space for those competitors wishing to bring their vehicles after attending the International Rally Tennessee.

Bona fide Canadian competitors (Driver and co-driver must be Canadian residents with CARS competition licenses and the entrant must be based in Canada) may pay the entry fee in Canadian Dollars at par.

Other bona fide foreign competitors (Driver and co-driver may not be US or Canadian residents and the entrant may not be based in US or Canada) will receive two hotel rooms for four nights free of charge. This benefit does not apply to foreign crews registering for Reconnaissance only.

Late Fee of \$150 will be charged after September 6, 2006.

3.10 Payment

3.11 Refunds

No refunds will be made after the Close of Entry on Wednesday, September 13, 2006 except for the following:

- Entrants whose entry has not been accepted will receive a full refund of the Entry Fee
- In the event the rally is cancelled, all Entrants will receive a full refund of the Entry Fee
- The organizers may refund, at their discretion, one half of the Entry Fee to those Entrants who, for reasons of "force majeure", are unable to start the rally.

Entrants who withdraw their entry by September 13, 2006 will receive a refund of the Entry Fee minus \$100 administrative fee.

3.12 Cancellation of the Rally

The organizer reserves the right to cancel the rally if an insufficient number of entries is received by the close of regular entry on September 6, 2006. The determination of what constitutes a sufficient number of entries will be solely at organizer's discretion. In case of event cancellation, the organizer will refund all received entry fees in full and will have no further obligation toward any entrant or a prospective entrant.

4 Insurance

4.1 Description of Liability Insurance Coverage

The Entry Fee includes the insurance premium for a standard \$5,000,000 general liability and participant accident coverage under the Rally New York, Ltd. Event Insurance Plan.

4.2 Competitor Auto Insurance Coverage

Each entrant is required to present proof of insurance coverage limits, such as the declaration page of the insurance policy valid in the United States of America (an insurance card only does not constitute such proof), at the time of Registration. The liability limits for reconnaissance vehicles, service vehicles and competition vehicles must be a minimum of \$100,000 per person, \$200,000 per accident, and \$50,000 for property damage.

4.3 Period of Insurance Coverage

All insurance coverages will come into effect at the opening of Rally Office and will end at the close of the Awards Ceremony and the Rally Office or at the moment of competitor retirement, exclusion or disqualification.

5 Advertising and Vehicle Identification

5.1 Compulsory Advertising

According to a diagram to be provided at Registration, competitors must place sponsor, event and championship identification provided by the organizer in the protected space in front of, above and below the start number.

Any advertising on the competition vehicle must not interfere with the car's official start number, as this would prevent vehicle recognition by event officials.

5.2 Vehicle Identification

Competitors are required to present competition vehicles at scrutineering with white, square door number panels at least 12 inches high and 20 inches wide, located on both front doors of the competition vehicle.

No vehicle class designations on door number panels will be used.

The organizer will provide a rally plate, start numbers according to the start list as well as compulsory sponsor, event and championship decals.

Cars must be presented at scrutineering with all start numbers and compulsory decals firmly affixed to the required places on the vehicle.

All names and logos of motorsport sanctioning bodies other than USAC, FIA and Rally New York, Ltd. on competition and service vehicles must be removed or neatly covered by a color-coded adhesive tape.

6 Tires

Tires must either meet the requirements of Appendix IV of the FIA Rally General Prescriptions or must be approved by DOT for highway use.

7 Fuel

The use of leaded fuel is prohibited on this rally.

Order your fuel directly from Can-Am Enterprises. Can-Am Enterprises supplies Sunoco Race Fuels. The orders will be delivered to the event and the fuel will be dispensed in the official refueling zones.

Competitors are reminded to order the fuel early. The ability of Can-Am Enterprises to deliver the fuel to the event is contingent upon receiving orders in a timely manner and in sufficient quantity.

8 Testing

Testing must be arranged through the organizer. No other testing is allowed.

9 Reconnaissance

Reconnaissance of the course on this event is permitted. Competitors may simply preview the course or they may prepare their own Pace Notes, or they may mark up the Course Notes or their Road Books. The use of Pace Notes, marked up Course Notes or marked up Road Books during competition is specifically permitted.

Reconnaissance is optional. However, it is recommended that competitors familiarize themselves with the course in the interest of safety. FIA Rally General Prescriptions, Appendix III, Article 2.2 3: Reconnaissance is considered a safety factor.

Reconnaissance of the Shakedown stage may be conducted in competition cars registered for the event. Articles 9.3 and 9.4 of these Supplementary Regulations do not apply for the Shakedown stage. All other restrictions on reconnaissance remain in force.

There will be no reconnaissance of the Mighty M Gaming Super Special at Monticello Raceway. However, competitors may inspect the course of the Super Special from the apron between the Grandstands and the track. Competitors may also inspect the course of the Super Special from the Grandstands. Free access to the Grandstands is from the 3rd floor when the building is open to the public between the hours of 10:00 am and 2:00 am. Competitors may inspect the course of the Super Special at any time starting Wednesday, September 20, 2006.

9.3 Reconnaissance Cars

Reconnaissance will be conducted in standard, unmarked road cars or in unmarked, single color Group N cars. Group N cars previously used for competition must have the start numbers and all stickers and decals removed entirely.

Vehicles larger than a small van or a small-size pickup truck are not allowed.

<u>Competitors must register Reconnaissance vehicles in the same manner as the</u> competition vehicles and service vehicles.

Reminder: Each entrant is required to present proof of insurance coverage limits, such as the declaration page of the insurance policy valid in the United States of America (an insurance card only does not constitute such proof), at the time of Registration. The liability limits for reconnaissance vehicles, service vehicles and competition vehicles must be a minimum of \$100,000 per person, \$200,000 per accident, and \$50,000 for property damage.

9.4 Identification of Reconnaissance Cars

Competitors must display on the windshield the reconnaissance car identification they will receive at Registration. Two competitors may share a reconnaissance car. The reconnaissance car identification for both teams must be displayed on the windshield.

9.5 Reconnaissance Speeds

All Special Stages be will open to regular traffic during Reconnaissance. Maximum speed on Special Stages is 30 (thirty) miles per hour or as posted, whichever is lower.

9.6 Reconnaissance Rules

Reconnaissance will be carried out in conformance to Article XIV of the FIA Rally General Prescriptions.

- Reconnaissance is allowed only during the times outlined in the Reconnaissance Schedule above. Under special and unusual circumstances, competitors may apply with the Clerk of the Course for reconnaissance at different times. Permission may be given at organizer's discretion.

- Only registered competitors, the driver and the co-driver, may travel in the reconnaissance car during Reconnaissance.
- Because of time limitations, the maximum of three passes over the nine stage roads listed in the Reconnaissance Schedule above is allowed for each entrant.
- During Reconnaissance, competitors may travel over a special stage road only in the direction indicated in the Reconnaissance Schedule above.
- The starts and the flying finishes of Special Stages will be identified by standard FIA signboards.
- Roads will be open to regular traffic during Reconnaissance.
- No other private vehicles will be allowed to enter special stage roads located on the Ten Mile River Scout Reservation (SS 1 through 8, 10, 12, 13, 15 and 18). However, these roads will be open to the Reservation vehicles in both directions during Reconnaissance.
- No other team cars, marked or unmarked, may travel during Reconnaissance on special stage roads owned by the Town of Tusten (SS 9, 11, 14, 16 and 17).
- After the date of publication of these Supplemental Regulations, no competitors or persons in any way associated with the entrant may travel over the special stage roads listed in Reconnaissance Schedule above outside the times listed in the Reconnaissance Schedule unless they live in the area or are traveling in an official capacity with the permission of the Clerk of the Course. This prohibition will continue after the Rally.

9.7 Reconnaissance Penalties

Marshals who will also be taking attendance will enforce the Reconnaissance rules. Any violations will be reported to the Stewards who will impose penalties at their discretion, including exclusion.

Stewards may investigate any nuisance complaints from residents and will apply penalties if they find merit in these complaints.

Competition cars must meet the technical and safety regulations of the sanctioning body that issued the logbook for the competition vehicle.

Cars that have FIA homologated roll cages installed must be presented with a FIA homologation certificate for the roll cage.

Group N cars must conform to the technical and safety regulations promulgated in Appendix J of the FIA International Sporting Code and must be presented with original homologation papers. Note: FIA Group N vehicles whose homologation expired no more than four years before the beginning of the current year are eligible to enter in Group N.

13.2 Parc Expose at the Start

It is compulsory for all competitors to present their cars in Parc Expose located on Erie Street in Narrowsburg, New York no later than 10:30 on Friday, September 22, 2006. Any car reporting after 10:30 will be fined \$100.

13.3 Ceremonial Start

The Ceremonial Start is compulsory for all competing cars and crews and will take place at TC 0 located on Erie Street in Narrowsburg, New York on Friday, September 22, 2006 at 11:00.

13.4 Overnight Parc Ferme

It is compulsory for all USRC competitors to present their cars to overnight Parc Ferme at the end of Leg 1 following the last service on Friday, September 22, 2006. The Parc Ferme at TC 8C is located at Lander's Campground in Narrowsburg, New York. Early arrival at TC 8C is authorized.

Competitors who do not enter the International and National USRC event and are participating only in the Regional NYRC events do not present their cars to overnight Parc Ferme on Friday night.

Overnight security in Parc Ferme will be provided.

All USRC competitors must present their cars at the exit from Parc Ferme at TC 8D at the beginning of Leg 2 on Saturday, September 23, 2006 according to their scheduled time. Any car removed from Parc Ferme at a different time will be penalized for early or late arrival. Competitors are reminded that they may enter the Parc Ferme on foot not earlier than 10 minutes before their scheduled time.

13.5 Park Expose at the Restart

It is compulsory for all competitors to present their cars to Parc Expose located at TC 8F on Erie Street in Narrowsburg, New York on Saturday, September 23, 2006 according to their scheduled time. There will be a penalty for late arrival at TC 8F. Early arrival at TC 8F is authorized.

13.6 Ceremonial Restart

The Ceremonial Restart is compulsory for all competitors and will take place at TC 8G located on Erie Street in Narrowsburg, New York on Saturday, September 23, 2006 at 8:15.

14.2 Starting System of Special Stages

At the start of special stages, an electronic countdown system, counting down by seconds and clearly visible to the crew from the start position, will be used. This system will be also electronically coupled to a start line detection system that records any situation when a car leaves the start line ahead of the correct signal or after the correct signal.

According to Article 19.4 of the FIA Rally General Prescriptions, any car not able to leave the start line of the special stage within the 20 seconds following a signal to do so is excluded and the car is immediately removed to a safe place.

According to Article 19.8 of the FIA Rally General Prescriptions, a false start, particularly the one made before the signal has been given, is penalized as follows:

1st offence: 10 seconds 2nd offence: 1 minute 3rd offence: 3 minutes

Further offences: At the Stewards' discretion.

These penalties do not prevent Stewards from imposing heavier penalties if they judge it necessary.

An electronic timing system will be used at the flying finish of special stages. The times will be measured electronically to 1/100th of a second and will be rounded to the nearest 1/10th of a second for the purposes of scoring.

Competitors must stop at the STOP control following the flying finish. Stopping between the flying finish and the STOP control is prohibited and will be reported to the Stewards who will impose penalties at their discretion.

14.3 Timing System

The timing system will be the FIA timing system described in Article XVIII of the FIA Rally General Prescription. A sample time card is in Appendix VI to the FIA Rally General Prescriptions.

Competitors and officials will note that the target times between time controls allow for the average speed of 30 miles per hour on liaison sections. The liaison sections are on main asphalt roads with the speed limit of 55 miles per hour.

14.4 Time Control Check-in Procedure

The check-in procedures described in Article 18.6 of the FIA Rally General Prescription apply.

According to Article 18.6.7 of the FIA Rally General Prescriptions for Rallies, the crew will not incur any penalty if the car enters the control area during the target check-in minute or the minute preceding it.

According to Article 18.6.8, the crew does not incur any penalty if the act of handing the time card to the appropriate marshal takes place during the target check-in minute.

Penalty for late arrival: 10 (ten) seconds per minute or fraction of a minute. Penalty for early arrival: 1 (one) minute per minute or fraction of a minute.

14.5 Exclusion

Article 18.8 of the FIA Rally General Prescriptions applies:

Any lateness exceeding 15 minutes on the target time between the two time controls, or a lateness exceeding 30 minutes at the end of each section and/or leg of the rally, or the total lateness for the whole of the rally of more than 60 minutes will be reported to the Stewards as a reason for exclusion. In calculating such exclusion, the actual time and not the penalty time (10 seconds per minute) applies.

14.6 Early Check-In

Crews are authorized to check in early at the following time controls:

Leg 1, Section 2: TC 8B Service D Out Leg 1, Section 2: TC 8C Parc Ferme In

Leg 2, Section 3: TC 8E Service E Out Leg 2, Section 3: TC 8F Parc Expose In

Leg 2, Section 5: TC 19 Mighty M Gaming Super Special 1 Leg 2, Section 5: TC 20 Mighty M Gaming Super Special 2 Leg 2, Section 5: TC 20A Finish Area In – Last Control

14.7 Identification of Officials

Rally Officials will be identified as follows:

Chief Steward: Shirt with USRC emblem

Senior Rally Officials: Yellow shirt with Rally New York emblem

Marshals and Time Control Officials: Orange or green vest

14.8 Competitor Safety

All competitors must be conversant with FIA Rally General Prescription Article 19.19 Competitor Safety, Appendix III Article 3.4 Road Book and the Accident & Safety Procedure for Competitors to be found in front of the Itinerary in the Road Book.

The following exceptions to the FIA Rally General Prescription will apply:

- A Red Cross sign will be used instead of the red SOS sign
- Competitors are required to carry three red reflective triangles in their competition vehicle instead of one.

At Registration, all competitors are required to sign a statement by which they certify their familiarity with the above safety procedures. No drivers meeting will be held or required.

14.9 USRC Super Rally Regulations

Under the Super Rally Format, any crew that has retired from Leg 1 and/or Leg 2 may restart the next leg. The restart order will be at the sole discretion of the Event Stewards.

The crew will be penalized with a 5-minute penalty added to the fastest time in the competitor's class for each missed stage that shall include special stage or Super Special Stage on which the crew retired. Should there be no finishers in the competitor's

class, the next lower class's fastest time will be used. Should there be no lower class, the fastest time from the next higher class will be used.

Should retirement occur after the last special stage or Super Special Stage, the crew will nonetheless be deemed to miss that last special stage or Super Special Stage.

Any crew that retired from the last Leg will be classified after the application of a 5-minute time penalty added to the fastest time in the competitor's class for each missed stage which shall include the special stage or Super Special Stage on which the crew retired. However, in order to be classified, their car must be present in the finish Parc Ferme until the publication of the provisional final results.

Cars may be removed from Parc Ferme into the Service Park for repairs. However, crews must present their cars in the Parc Ferme at least one hour before the time of the start of the next leg. The Clerk of the Course may require that the vehicle be scrutineered before starting the next Leg.

All other applicable penalties that have been accrued will be assessed per event regulations.

NYRC events, which are one-day events, are not subject to Super Rally Regulations.

15 Servicing

15.1 Locations

There will be one Central Service Park for the duration of the event: The Service Park is located at Lander's Campground in Narrowsburg, New York.

Servicing is allowed only in the Central Service Park. Outside the Central Service Park, only the driver and the co-driver can work on the car using tools and materials carried in the competition car unless servicing is specifically prohibited under Parc Ferme conditions such as in Parc Ferme on Friday night and in all Time Control zones.

15.2 Access

Lander's Campground: From Wednesday, September 20, 2006, 8:00

To Sunday, September 24, 12:00 noon

15.3 Security

Overnight security will be provided at the Service Park.

15.4 Refueling Zones

Competitors may refuel their cars only in the official Refueling Zones located immediately after the Exit Control from the Service Park. Refueling in the Refueling Zones will be carried out according to Article 12.6 of the FIA Rally General Prescriptions.

In addition, competitors may refuel their cars on the liaison sections at gas stations identified in the Road Book. When refueling at a gas station, the fuel must be dispensed from the gas pump directly into the fuel tank of the competition car. Only the driver or the co-driver may perform this operation.

16 Gravel Cars

The use of gravel cars is prohibited.

17 Awards

17.1 Awards Ceremony

The Awards Ceremony will take place on the 3rd Floor at Monticello Raceway on Saturday, September 23, 2006 at 21:30.

The champagne-spraying ceremony with fireworks for the first three crews in overall classification in AWD classes and the first three crews in overall classification in 2WD classes will take place at the Ceremonial Finish on the apron at Monticello Raceway on Saturday, September 23, 2006 at 19:30.

17.2 Awards

Competitors must attend the awards ceremony in order to receive the awards.

The attendance at the Awards Ceremony by the first three crews in the USRC AWD Classification and the first three crews in the USRC 2WD Classification is mandatory.

18 Final Checks

The Final Checks will take place on the apron at Monticello Raceway on Saturday, September 23, 2006 at 19:00.

Cars subject to final checks by the decision of the Stewards must have one representative of the entrant as well as mechanics (in case of dismantling) present at the final check.

19 Publication of Provisional Classification

The provisional classification will be published on the Official Notice Board located on the 3rd Floor at Monticello Raceway on Saturday, September 23, 2006 at 21:00.

20 Protests and Inquiries

20.1 Procedure for Submitting Protests and Inquiries

All protests and inquiries must be submitted in writing to the Clerk of the Course or his representative.

20.2 Protest Fee

Each protest must be submitted together with a protest fee of \$250 in cash.

20.3 Additional Fees

Any protest requiring dismantling of a car will require an additional fee as follows:

- \$350 (cash) for a clearly defined part of the car (Example: Engine, transmission, etc.)
- \$500 (cash) for a protest involving the whole car

The expenses of dismantling and transporting the car will be paid by the claimant if the protest is unfounded or by the competitor against whom the protest was lodged if the protest is upheld. If the actual expenses are higher than the amount of the deposit, the paying party must pay the difference. If the actual expenses are lower, the difference will be refunded.
