SPECTATOR GUIDE

Spectator Safety

Spectators may watch International Rally New York only from designated Spectator Areas supervised by trained Safety Marshals and equipped with emergency radio communications and other emergency services. The access to each Spectator Area is along a separate access road and not over the Special Stage road. Spectators are prohibited from entering and walking along the Special Stage road. For your safety, please obey the instructions of Safety Marshals in the Spectator Areas. There is no spectator access and spectator viewing at any intersection of roads unless the intersection is a designated Spectator Area!

Please drive safely and obey speed limits
We never race on public roads open to regular traffic

Spectator Area at Red Star Road and Otens Road in Wawarsing

This is a tarmac special stage.

Admission is free.

Approach from Route 52 over Oak Ridge Road from Greenfield Park.

Friday, September 7, 2007 1:00 PM – 5:00 PM Cars will pass three times!

Spectator Area at Concord Resort and Golf Club in Monticello (Thompson)

This is a spectacular amphitheater-like Spectator Area where you can sit on the side of the hill and watch rally cars passing over a long section of this tarmac special stage in both directions and watch servicing of rally cars in the Service Park nearby.

Hosted by Monticello Fire Department, admission \$5 per person and \$5 for parking, food service

Exit 105 on Route 17 Quickway, take Route 42 north and turn right onto Concord Road after the shopping center.

Friday, September 7, 2007 5:00 PM – 8:00 PM Cars will pass four times!

Spectator Area at Ten Mile River Reservation in Narrowsburg

This is a gravel special stage on private property with controlled access. You can watch servicing of rally cars at Reservation HQ also on Route 26.

Hosted by Lava Fire Department, admission \$5 per person and \$5 for parking, food service

Approach on Route 26 - Crystal Lake Road and turn into the Scout Camp at the Rally New York sign

Saturday, September 8, 2007 10:00 AM – 6:00 PM Cars will pass five times!

Welcome to International Rally New York 2007!

The best rally drivers from the United States and from abroad will compete in this exciting event. The course is 400 miles long with 100 miles of Special Stages. International Rally New York 2007 is a round of the United States Rally Championship. It also counts toward the New York Rally Championship. We are grateful to the Governments of the Town of Wawarsing, the Village of Ellenville, the Town of Thompson, Ulster County Tourism, Sullivan County Visitors Association, the Management of the Ten Mile River Scout Reservation, local fire departments and emergency medical services, local business and civic organizations, residents and local businesses, sponsors, law enforcement personnel, countless volunteers and amateur radio operators for their support.

What is a Stage Rally?

It is a car rally with a number of Special Stages linked together by transit sections. The rally cars are typically small sedans such as Subaru Impreza. On the Special Stages on public roads closed to civilian traffic, the rally cars start at one-minute intervals and race against the clock. On the transit sections, the rally cars drive in regular traffic and obey all traffic laws. If a competitor is observed speeding on a transit section, he is penalized and may be disqualified from the rally.
