SPECTATOR GUIDE

Spectator Safety

Spectators may watch Rally New York only from designated Spectator Areas supervised by trained Safety Marshals and equipped with emergency radio communications and other emergency services. The access to each Spectator Area is along a separate access road and not over the Special Stage road. Spectators are prohibited from entering and walking along the Special Stage road. For your safety, please obey the instructions of Safety Marshals in the Spectator Areas.

Please drive safely and obey speed limits We never race on public roads open to regular traffic

- Service Area at Lander's Campground located behind the Tusten Town Hall in Narrowsburg, Free Admission
- Blind Pond Spectator Area is located at the intersection of Blind Pond Road and Dexheimer Road off Route 22 in Narrowsburg. Approach from Route 22 and park on Dexheimer Road. <u>Free Admission</u>
- Mahls Pond Spectator Area is on Mahls Pond Road in Narrowsburg just north of Cochecton Turnpike. Approach from Route 23 and park along Mahls Pond Road.

Welcome to Rally New York 2005!

The best rally drivers from the United States and from abroad will compete in this exciting event. The course is 240 miles long with 65 miles of Special Stages. Rally New York 2005 is the third round of the five-event National Auto Sport Association Eastern States Rally Championship. We are grateful to the Government of County of Sullivan, the Town of Tusten, the Village of Monticello, the Ten Mile River Scout Reservation, the Sullivan County Visitors Association, local business and civic organizations, residents and local businesses, sponsors, law enforcement personnel, countless volunteers and amateur radio operators for their support.

What is a Stage Rally?

It is a car rally with a number of Special Stages linked together by transit sections. The rally cars are typically small sedans such as Subaru Impreza. On the Special Stages on public roads closed to civilian traffic, the rally cars start at one-minute intervals and drive at full speed. On the transit sections, the rally cars drive in regular traffic and obey all traffic laws. If a competitor is observed speeding on a transit section, he is penalized and may be disqualified from the rally.
