Spectator Safety

Spectators may watch International Rally New York only from designated Spectator Areas supervised by trained Safety Marshals and equipped with emergency radio communications and other emergency services. The access to each Spectator Area is along a separate access road and not over the Special Stage road. Spectators are prohibited from entering and walking along the Special Stage road. For your safety, please obey the instructions of Safety Marshals in the Spectator Areas.

Welcome to International Rally New York 2005!

The best rally drivers from the United States and from abroad will compete in this exciting event. The course is 366 miles long with 102 miles of Special Stages. International Rally New York 2005 is the third round of the United States Rally Championship. It is a FIA internationally listed event that is sanctioned by USAC and presented by NASA. It also counts toward the Eastern States Rally Championship organized by NASA Rally Sport. We are grateful to the Government of County of Sullivan, the Town of Tusten, the Town of Liberty, the Ten Mile River Scout Reservation, the Sullivan County Visitors Association, the Mighty M Gaming at Monticello Raceway, local business and civic organizations, residents and local businesses, sponsors, law enforcement personnel, countless volunteers and amateur radio operators for their support. What is a Stage Rally?

It is a car rally with a number of Special Stages linked together by transit sections. The rally cars are typically small sedans such as Subaru Impreza. On the Special Stages on public roads closed to civilian traffic, the rally cars start at one-minute intervals and race against the clock. On the transit sections, the rally cars drive in regular traffic and obey all traffic laws. If a competitor is observed speeding on a transit section, he is penalized and may be disqualified from the rally.
